Some parents have requested additional sheets (Mystery Maths being a popular one!) - if anyone would like additional printed resources, then please get in touch with the school and we can post them out.






OUR LOWER PRIMARY GLOW TEAM ACTIVITY

WHAT DOES LEARNING LOOK LIKE FOR UPPER PRIMARY




OUR UPPER PRIMARY GLOW TEAM ACTIVITY

Our Upper Primary class have been very active on Glow Teams. Here's a few screenshots of what they've been up to.











WHAT DOES LEARNING LOOK LIKE FOR SECONDARY

EMERGENCY CHILDCARE & ASN HUBS

Most parents will be aware that the school has been open as an Emergency Childcare Hub since before the Easter holidays. This is childcare provision for the children of keyworkers, who have no alternative available. Applications for this are made through: elc@shetland.gov.uk

We also have an ASN Hub twice per week which provides respite and childcare for students with Additional Support Needs. Families who require this service are asked to speak to the school in the first instance. These facilities are staffed by the BJHS Early Years and Learning Support staff, with additional staff from within the Shetland Islands Council where required.
