Communicating Communication between Baltasound JHS and parents

should be prioritised, regular, jargon free, clear, accessible and specific. Communication throughout the year will include the following:

- At least one formal Parents' Event to speak to the class teacher, Pupil Support, DHT and HT.
- At least one opportunity for parents to learn in class, with their child (P1, P4, P7 and S3) literacy and numeracy should be prioritised during these days.



Bring Your Parent To School Day

- At least one opportunity for parents to come in to school, view classwork, achievements, wall displays and discuss informally with the class teacher, Pupil Support, DHT or HT.
- Opportunities to feedback made available at each parental engagement opportunity.
- A twice termly newsletter highlighting achievements, opportunities for involvement and diary dates (printed and bag dropped, emailed and on school website).
- At least one written report per student, per year.
- At least one anonymous survey/questionnaire for parents to complete; the feedback from this to be shared with staff and parents in the following session with action points to be addressed.
- An up-to-date school website and Facebook page, highlighting achievements, events, dates, policies, documents and contact information.
- A yearly celebratory event for all students, highlighting the achievements of the past session including personal, group, volunteering and fundraising achievements/milestones.

Baltasound JHS take pride in being an open door school, whereby parents feel comfortable discussing any issues with SLT, without appointment.

Baltasound JHS will provide opportunity for, and promote, volunteering amongst the parent forum. This will include opportunities to:

Assist, modify and initiate improvements within the school estate (inside the building and in the playground).

- Assist with literacy/numeracy/health & wellbeing interventions in school.


- Information Evenings suggested by Parent Council or Parent Forum, i.e. Internet Safety/Social Media/ CfE.

Decision Making

Parenting Baltasound JHS support parents through our Bookbug Programme (with Shetland Library) and parenting support/respite is available through the Bruce Family Centre and Short Breaks facilities in Lerwick. This is a Getting It Right For Every Child (GIRFEC), multi-agency approach to:

- Promote early intervention.
- Support vulnerable children, young people and their families.
- Support young people with complex additional support needs and their families.

The Bookbug Programme has been an excellent way of encouraging our parents to read and sing with their child and enables a smooth transition into Baltasound JHS Early Years. The school has strong links with Voluntary Action Shetland, Children & Families Social Work Team, NHS Shetland, Police Scotland, Community Learning and Development, Youth Services, North Isles Learning Partnership and Active Schools.

Collaborating With The Community Baltasound JHS is the cornerstone of Unst; with organisations, clubs and groups either linking directly with the school for inter-disciplinary or inter-generational learning activities or members of school staff being integral to the committee or organisation structure.

This allows the school to be at the forefront of community projects and for school opportunities to involve the wider community and serve the needs of both parents and Unst residents.
